

Judges 21:8-25



Summary of Judges 21:8-12 The 11 tribes identify one region who DIDN'T come to the meeting where they vowed NOT to give their daughters

They sent 12,000 soldiers to this area & wipe out EVERYONE except for 400 women



Judges 21:13-18 After hiding in these caves for 4 months, messengers of peace are sent to the 600 men of Benjamin

God sovereignly allowed ALL of this sinning to happen



The glimpse we're allowed to see reveals it was at least in part to bring the Israelites back to the God they kept wandering away from

NOTHING will get in the way of God's sovereign plan (our sin CAN'T change it, stop it, or hinder it from happening)

Judges 21:19-24 It's believed that this feast mentioned is most likely the Feast of the Tabernacles (Sukkot) – it's a Jewish Autumn Festival

This was the plan: 200 Benjaminites (without wives) were to wait in the vineyards

When the women came out to dance, these 200 men would go out from hiding and grab a wife for himself



This was spun & twisted to present this kidnapping & forced marriage as actually a good thing!

The result everyone went back to their home & life seemed to go back to "normal"

Judges 21:25

This verse really summarizes the entire book of Judges

Unfortunately, Israel decided to NOT follow God & instead they looked to another source...themselves

Romans 1:18-20 We serve a Just God When we deliberately break God's rules, when we try to do things on our own terms, we're guilty

If we remain in an untreated state, the wrath of God looms over us Romans 1:21 Romans 1:22-23

Instead of following God, who NEVER led them astray, they chose to wander away & serve idols (an inanimate object)

Romans 1:24-25 God had been previously holding back the flood gates of the consequences of sin, but that was NO longer the case

God allowed Israel to hit low points, so they would cry to God (so they would beg God to take away their discomfort)

Hardships AREN'T necessarily BAD, they often help us to see our NEED (they stop us & shake us out of our false sense of security)
