



join Him and sail away




Mark 4:37

located in basically a valley






This means without notice  
these storms can pop up




Jesus left instantly

awaiting them)




So, the disciples (many

filling with water




This was NO small storm

NO sign of stopping





afraid of drowning




This is the **ONLY** account

flesh – He was human)






Mark 4:39

In the Greek, this storm  
**DOESN'T** settle down  
it ceases entirely and  
completely – **ALL** at once



This was authority over  
nature like the disciples  
**NEVER** before saw




Jesus says actually two Greek words “Peace – Be Still” (literally the statement is translated “Peace Be Muzzled” or “Peace Be Silent”)



Mark 4:40-41

After rebuking the storm,  
Jesus now rebukes  
His disciples



The disciples had some faith  
(they did cry out to Jesus  
for help) yet after Jesus  
calms the storm,  
they're still astonished
