Jesus equates the physical act of murder to a person who has bottled up, undealt with anger in their heart

DON'T let the busyness of life stop you from keeping short accounts with one another!

Many times, because we HAVEN'T kept short enough accounts, an issue has gotten more complicated and festered

Matthew 5:23

"Presenting an offering at the altar" was part of a Jewish person's way of worship (they routinely and regularly bring their best as a way to give back to God)

God cared greatly about the heart behind these sacrifices

If while an in-progress sacrifice is happening an unresolved conflict comes to your mind (what are you supposed to do?

Matthew 5:23-24 What does it say? Stop, do NOT continue, leave your sacrifice and GO, get right with & your brother!!!

If while we're in the process of ANY act of worship and a known issue with our brother crosses our mind we've got to STOP and GO get it right

The main reason for Jesus coming to the world was to reconcile God's people back to God

If God is that interested in restoring and reconciling mankind to Himself - DON'T you think God's equally interested in us reconciling with one another?

Matthew 5:9 Followers of Jesus are to go out of their way to make sure peace is pursued and sought after

The Biblical distinction between forgiveness and reconciliation

ALL of us are commanded to forgive

Colossians 3:12-17

Reconciliation is different from forgiveness
