

Isaiah 66:1-2



This Book is written by the prophet Isaiah to Judah after the reign of King Solomon, once the Kingdom had been divided

There's a strong call to repent to turn from their present sinful trajectory and return to a worshipping and loving relationship



God is holy – He CAN'T condone or have any part of sin God is also merciful — this is why He sent Jesus to pay for our sin and restore what (SAIAH) our sin broke

In Isaiah 53 – Jesus is depicted as the Suffering Servant

In Isaiah 9 – Jesus is revealed as the Righteous King

"Tremble" = full of awe and reverence; knee knocking fear



Entering into a living relationship with Jesus Christ requires a transformation in our hearts and an aligning with God's Word Obedience by itself is incomplete, our obedience needs to involve reverence (a deep inward elevation of God)

Exodus 20:18-21

Job 1:1



When you start to see how much God HATES sin it puts a distain in your heart and life for sin as well

A healthy fear and trembling of God repels us from sin

Isaiah 66:2b

When the Holy Spirit takes Scripture and convicts our hearts, we MUST be ready and willing to change (there's no neutral)

II Timothy 3:16-17

We should be sensitive enough to God's leading that when we're instructed we act and apply God's Word to our lives

The more I revere and hold Scripture high and exalted the more likely I am to act
