James 2:1-7

James draws our attention to how we view and interact with others

FAVORITISM

James 2:1

This favoritism was a present practice, which needed to stop (the original were guilty of showing special treatment to select individuals solely based upon outward appearance in the

II Corinthians 8:9 James 2:2-4



"Assembly" – synagogue (this was the Jewish person's church)

James 2:4



Ultimately, the expected response to this illustration is to agree (these types of distinctions have NO place among believers) **James 2:5-7**

It is through Jesus Christ that the script is flipped



James finishes this section by asking 3 rhetorical questions



I. Is it NOT the Rich Who Oppress You?

"Oppress" = to exercise harsh control over another; dominion

II. Is it NOT the Rich Who Personally Drag you into Court?

The rich were putting their hands on the poor and physically dragging them to court

III. Is it NOT the Rich Who Blaspheme Jesus Christ?

"Blaspheme" = to speak evil against; to vilify; to defame
