GREAT RESPONSIBILITY IN TEACHING

James 3:1 What James is about to communicate MUST be evaluated from the standpoint of this shared bond in Christ

Matthew 12:33-37

EVERY "careless word" that creeps out of our mouths, we will be held accountable (That's a scary thought!)

"Careless" = Lazy, useless; barren or fruitless



It would be better for us to remain silent, then to open our mouths and incur the judgement of God The words that come out of our mouths begin in our hearts

What we think about and what we dwell upon and what we desire after these things dominate and direct our lives

That's God's standard, when it comes to ALL our speech, however, that standard is ratcheted up for those entrusted to teach James 3:1

During the time of the early church, teaching was highly esteemed (many sought after the notoriety and recognition

Unless God is clearly directing you to become a teacher, DON'T (handling God's Word takes prayer and care

Being a teacher means you will be held to a higher standard and it also means there's a potential greater punishment **James 4:17**

A spiritual leader starts by humbly acknowledging their personal desperate need, which is only satisfied in Christ (sensitively surrendering and faithfully following God's lead and direction)

The primary vessel used by teachers is the tongue (there are plenty of opportunities for ANY teacher to misspeak or muddy the waters)

There is a potential for Bible teachers to either knowingly or even unknowingly lead people astray by their words
