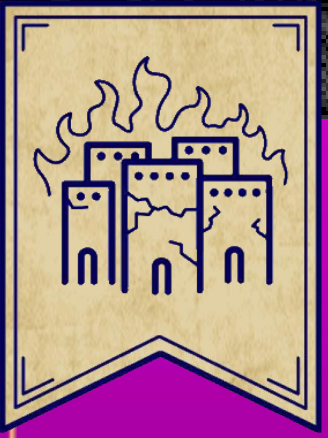

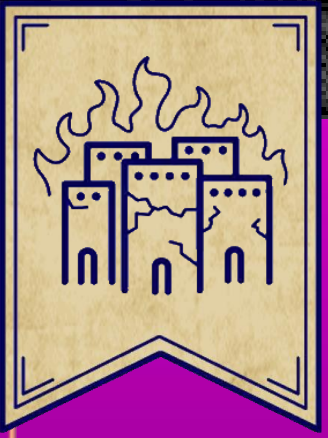




NO one is able to live off the faith

with the Lord

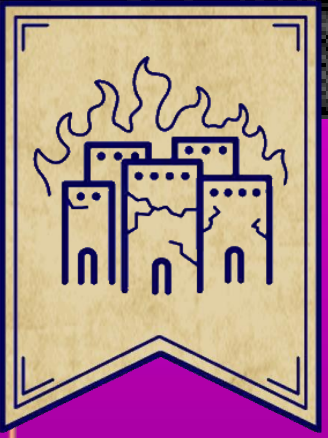
Nahum 2:1-13

wrath of God





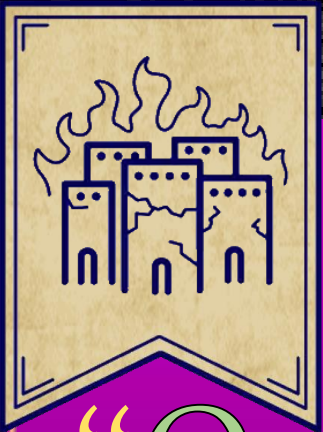
The Assyrians had completely disregarded God over and over again





Nahum: Destruction and Devastation Declared



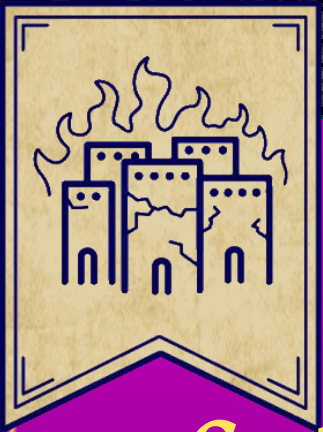


Nahum 1:1

“Oracle” = a heavy message; a weighty pronouncement; a proclaimed burden (which is heavy and produces sorrow and grief)

Nahum 2:1-2

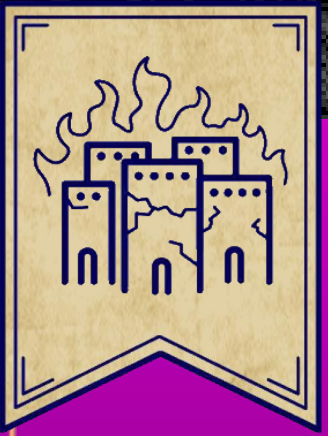




“The one who scatters” = speaks of the Babylonian King (who’s coming) named Nebopolassar (the father of Nebuchadnezzar)

“Scatters” = dispersed by mauling



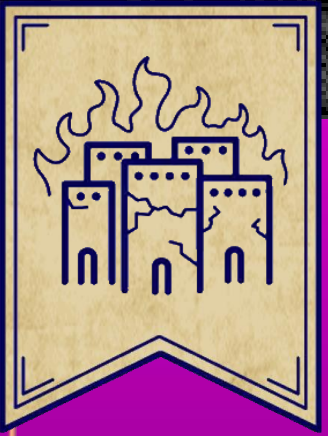


Nahum 2:3

Nahum 2:4-7

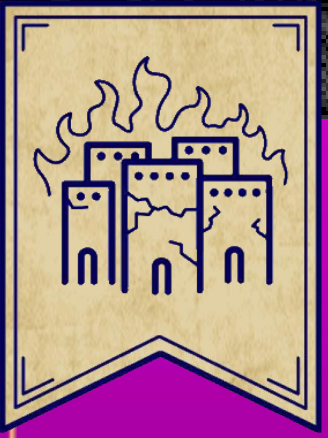




Seeing the approaching

Nahum 2:6-7

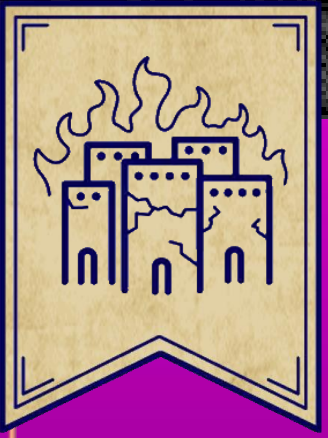




The source of their strength and security (the Tigris River) was going to actually be used against them

Nahum 2:8-10

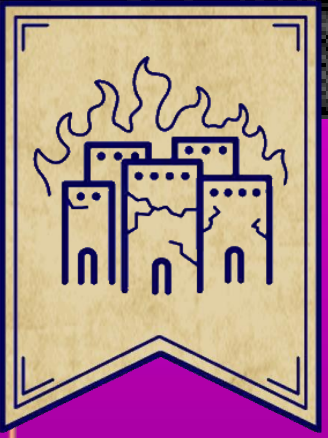




This once prideful and self-reliant
