
Why does God allow bad things to happen?

Psalm 23:1-6

Every moment of every situation is a forever reminder of the ominous shadow dangling over us (death- the consequence of sinis perpetually present)

Whatever happens (both the good and the bad) is allowed by God for a particular purposesometimes unknown to us



II Corinthians 4:16-18

The Valley of the Shadow of Death



Psalm 23 is a Psalm for people who are shaken and facing turmoil



Facing unexplainable tragedy and King David starts by rooting himself to the personal and intimate nature of God John 10:11-18

This Psalm is written from the perspective of the sheep

Isaiah 53:6

Psalm 23:1-3

In the Lord, we lack nothing, we're fully satisfied

Like sheep, human beings tend to have a mob mentality, we're fearful and timid, we're stubborn and stupid

However, in that state, God chooses us, calls us by name, engrafts us into His family, and delights in caring for us

The picture being painted is a danger-free spot of rest

"Paths" = are well-worn trails (and sheep still need a shepherd to guide them NO matter how obvious the path appears) Psalm 23:4-6

Walking again speaks to the feelings of being secure in the middle of incredibly difficult situations (continuously moving through what is temporary)



"The Rod" is used for discipline purposes (to stop wandering sheep from going astray)

"The Staff" is used to lead and sometimes protect the sheep

In the middle of the worst, which an enemy can dish out, and King David found peace and joy in God (reason to celebrate)

"My Cup Overflows" — this is a state of constant overflow
