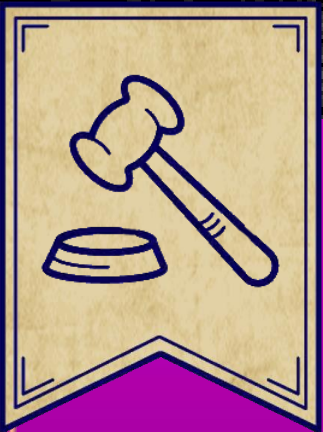

Both Israel and Judah had failed to keep their end of the conditional covenant given to Moses at Mount Sinai

Exodus 19:1-6





Micah looks at the consequence of the conditional covenant, which it looks ahead to God's rescue plan



Micah: Covenant Established





Deuteronomy repeats and expounds upon aspects of Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus and Numbers

Deuteronomy 6:4-9





The message was clear –
God wanted Israel to prioritize Him
(to willingly show their loyalty by
loving Him above ALL)

Deuteronomy 11:1





“Always” = Forever, Repeated
continually at ALL times

John 14:15

Deuteronomy 11:1-7





Moses was addressing people,
who had firsthand knowledge
(they had observed miracle upon miracle
from the Lord)





Failure to follow the first time
brought about God's discipline
and now there's a chance to make the
right decision – to follow God

Deuteronomy 11:8-12





God's protection would be
with them if they remained loyal
and chose to follow His commands

Deuteronomy 11:13-17





But despite God ONLY
wanting good— there's a word of
caution, warning them against being
decieved and led astray

Deuteronomy 11:18-25





Despite larger and more skilled
armies, God promised to give
His people decisive victories
ALL along the way

Deuteronomy 11:26-32





Upon hearing this message
the people were left standing
at a fork in the road
(there was a choice to make)
