have traded that relationship
for idolatry

Unfortunately the Jewish people did
NOT heed God's strong warning

Micah 1:1

Micah served as a prophet during the reigns of 3 Judean kings

Micah 1:2-7





God sees ALL and knows ALL
(Nothing is hidden from Him)
and He is the Character Witness
against them





Everything which they found
protection and provision in
would be melted away or burned up
by God's power





Instead of being loyal to
the One True God,
they pursued pathetic and puny
human conceived pagan gods





ALL idols and ALL financial gain associated with this evil was going to be burned, taken, and left desolate

Micah 1:8-16





At his core, Micah lamented and wept bitterly (he was grieved and broken over this idolatrous sin)





NO human effort can fix their
brokenness (All that was left was to
allow for deep mourning)

Micah would ONLY weep at the
coming consequences





BEFORE God sent the Assyrians
(and eventually the Babylonians)
God sent Micah and other prophets
with warnings
