



## Micah was tasked by God with a message of repentance


Micah chapter 4 infuses hope into what feels like, and honestly seems like, a completely hopeless situation





## Micah 3:12

Due to those leaders, who intentionally led people astray, Mount Zion (where the Temple resided) would be destroyed



Micah 4:1-5



From the pinnacle peak of Zion (the location of the Temple – inside the city of Jerusalem) the Messiah will judge the world

Micah 4:6-8



When the Messiah physically reigns (in the future) ALL those who have been pushed aside or driven away will be gathered together and united as one in Christ

"The lame" = one who stumbles; one who slips and falls



"The outcasts" = those who are banished and scattered

The ONLY way the lame and the outcasts will find strength is in God's grace (He's the One Who will restore)

God is going to restore splendor to Jerusalem in that coming future day, when the Messiah reigns

Micah 4:9-13



We live in a broken world stained by sin and until Jesus returns to retrieve His bride – sin still exists
