Micah wanted the faithful remnant
to remember the Messiah is coming





“Micah” = Who is like our God?

He is gracious and forgiving –
full of compassion, addressing and
dealing with sin once for all





Like MOST Jewish people,
they saw the Messiah arriving
ONE time – in an isolated,
singular event





Micah: The Messiah is Returning





Micah 7:1-4a

What Micah shared, personally impacted him – he was deeply distressed by Judah's denial and defiance against God





After looking around,
Micah found that Godly men
were few and far between





Together, these wicked men
twisted justice – they conspired and
schemed together to exploit the poor

Micah 7:4b-6





Watchmen were stationed
ALL over the wall with the purpose
of watching and then warning the city
of coming danger





Fully aware of the coming judgment
and the carnal condition of the
people of Judah's heart –
Micah is heavy hearted





We DON'T live in the present
without hope – our Messiah,
our Deliverer and Rescuer,
Jesus Christ is returning!

Micah 7:7-8





The word “salvation”
carries with it the idea of moving
from a place of distress to a place
of safety (deliverance)

Micah 7:9-13





The purpose of their discipline
was to be brought back to God
(God wanted revival in their
hearts and lives)





In that future day,
God will expand Israel's borders
and He will bless ALL people through
the Abrahamic Covenant

Micah 7:14-20





Micah pleads with God
to restore the good old days,
when God's hand of blessing
was visible on Israel





This letter was written primarily
to encourage the remaining
faithful few in the midst of
the coming disaster





Their hope was that God
would extend them grace—
that God would uphold His promise
to restore them
