I. Woe to the Selfish

Habakkuk 2:6-8

Babylon mercilessly came in and
confiscated other nations
Babylon was going to be
plundered and looted





II. Woe to Those Who Possess False Security

Habakkuk 2:9-11

Upon conquering another nation, Babylon
would impose crippling tributes upon them
(kind of like a heavy monthly tax)





Babylon lived life like there was
NO higher power that could
challenge their strength





III. Woe to the Violent

Habakkuk 2:12-14

Everything Babylon wanted they
took by force— through violence and
bloodshed their empire expanded





IV. Woe to Those Who Seek Self-Gratification

Habakkuk 2:15-17

Babylon's appetite for pleasure
was never quenched





Lebanon was known for their
natural resources, particularly
their glorious cedar trees





V. Woe to the Idolatrous

Habakkuk 2:18-20

An idol is ANYTHING we refuse to give up – that we erect in a place that usurps God's rightful place





Marduk was Babylon's primary idol
(he could not see, speak, move, breath,
and he could NOT save ANYONE)
