I. Spiritual Takeaway #1

We Can Find Peace in the Middle of Pain

Habakkuk 3:16





In the middle of this coming day
of distress, Habakkuk again commits
to wait quietly on the Lord

Isaiah 26:3-4





Habakkuk intentionally slows himself down and adjusts his eyes and despite the coming difficulty, he is given peace





II. Spiritual Takeaway #2

We Can Rejoice in Times of Great Loss

Habakkuk 3:17





What Habakkuk and all of Judah
were about to experience was complete
economic collapse and catastrophe





Habakkuk 3:18

Habakkuk regardless of his
circumstances chooses to rejoice
in the same Lord
(He ALONE is worthy
ALWAYS of praise)

We Are Strengthened for the Journey Ahead

Habakkuk 3:19





“High Places” = in Scripture
refers to either difficult to reach places
OR to summits or pinnacles of victory

challenging and difficult path
to bring us to the place of victory,
which is ONLY found in Christ
