


This is a woman, guilty and FULLY aware of her guilt she was caught in the middle of a humiliating act




John 8:1-2

This historical event took place during the last 6 months of Jesus' earthly ministry and His eyes are firmly fixed on the cross


After spending a night where prayer is central, Jesus, first thing in the morning, heads back to the Temple

John 8:3-5




Scribes were experts in the interpretation of the Law Pharisees were religious leaders who observed, taught, and even enforced the Scribes interpretation of the Law (

"Caught" = (written in the perfect tense) NOT ONLY was she caught, she was STILL guilty of the act




If Jesus recommended that the woman be released, then He would be guilty of breaking the Law or at least treating it nonchalantly



John 8:6-7




No one knows exactly what Jesus wrote on the ground
