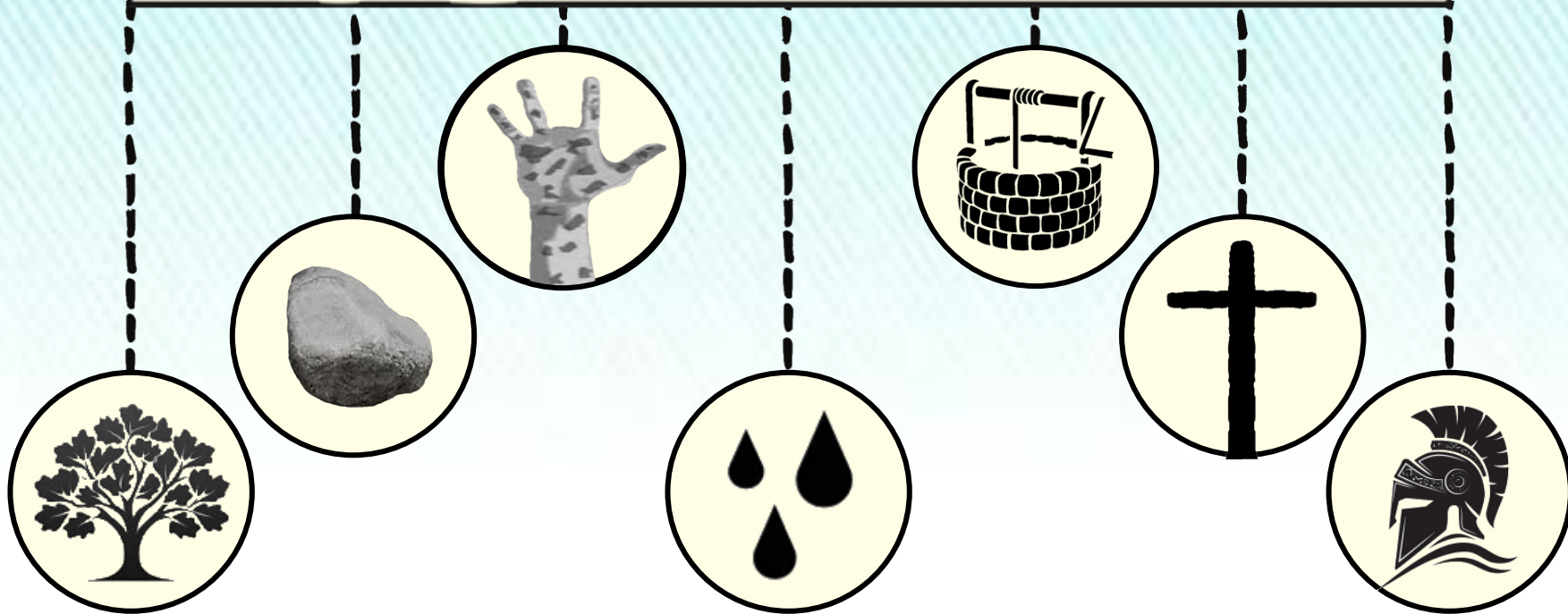


Encounters with Grace



The Book of Leviticus uses the word “unclean” about 100 times



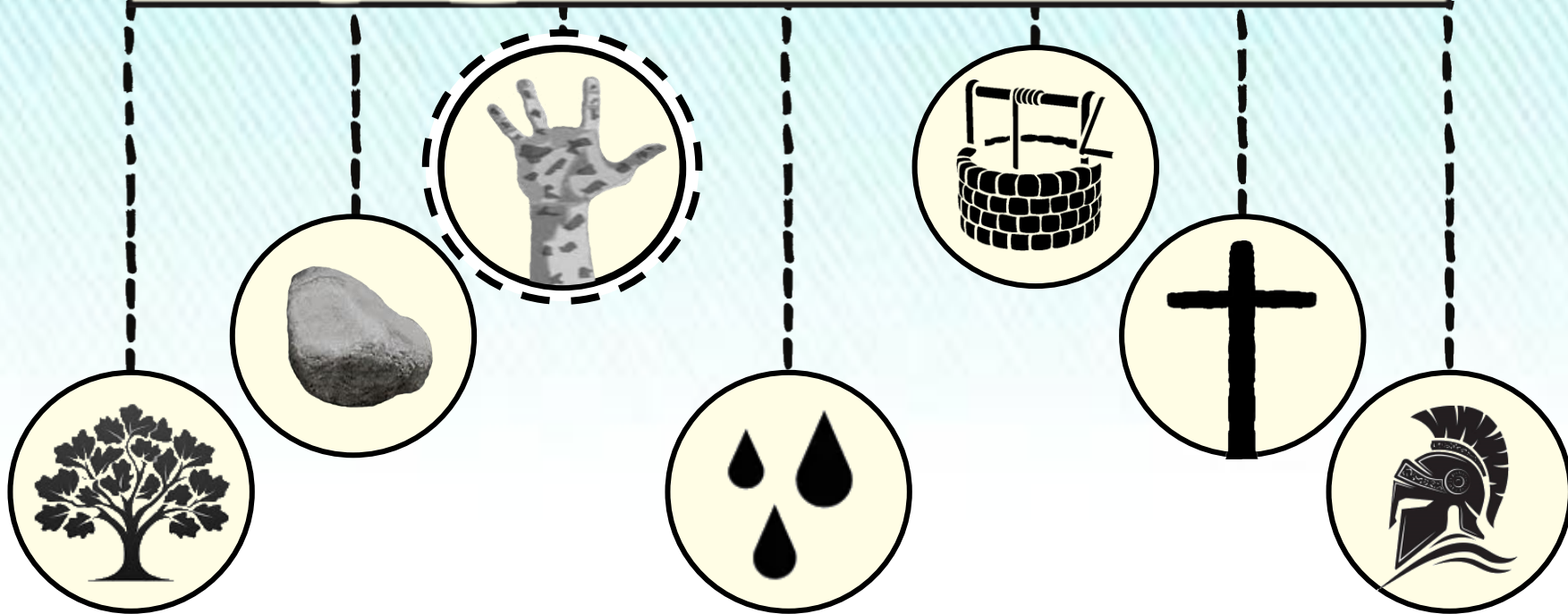
These **10 lepers** see Jesus
approaching and they seize
the opportunity – they ask for
Jesus to have **mercy** on them



Jesus **washed** them clean and
the priests were going to **verify**
that cleansing and the 10 lepers
would be **restored** to clean



Healing The Ten Lepers



Luke 17:11

Samaritans were tainted by
intermarrying with **heathens**, they
ALSO ONLY used the Pentateuch
They believed the primary place
of worship was to be at
Mount Gerizim



Luke 17:12-13

ANYONE with this **infectious disease** were to live at a distance
(on the outskirts of towns)
away from family and friends



Leprosy ALSO effected the
vocal cords – so this declaration
would have been VERY **raspy**



Priests had separated miracles
into TWO categories (**general**
miracles and **Messianic** miracles)
Leprosy was a Messianic miracle



These lepers were **broken**
(they **KNEW** they had a **NEED**)
and when they saw Jesus coming,
they **cried out** to Him for help

Luke 17:14



These lepers left Jesus solely on
the promise to **go and show**
themselves to the priests
(and their **faith** was rewarded)

“They were cleansed” = to be pure; to be
without stain or spot; to have ALL filth
or impurity **completely removed**



Luke 17:15-16

This Samaritan comes back to
Jesus – clearly wanting
MORE than **healing**, this guy
wanted the **Healer**



Luke 17:17-19

The ONLY ONE to return to Jesus,
giving Him **rightful praise**,
is this foreigner (this person,
who was not Jewish)
