



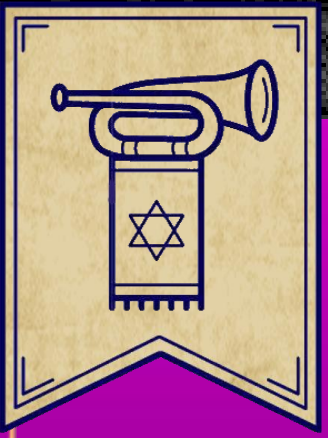
# Messengers: Zechariah





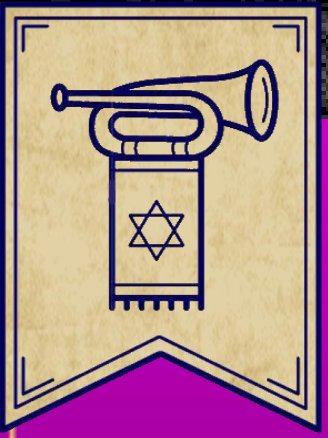
Evil and sin are real

in every book!





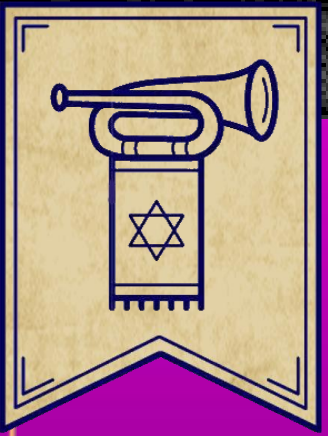
Zechariah's vision pulls the curtain back and reminds God's people that the enemy never has the final word





# Zechariah: Four Horns, Four Craftsmen, and One Deliverer

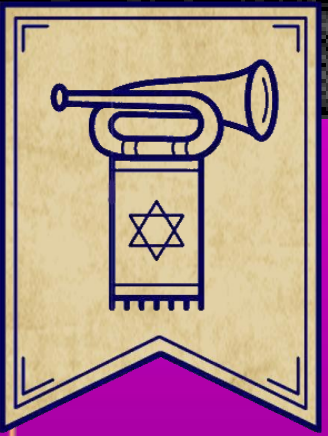




## Zechariah 1:18-19

presently facing

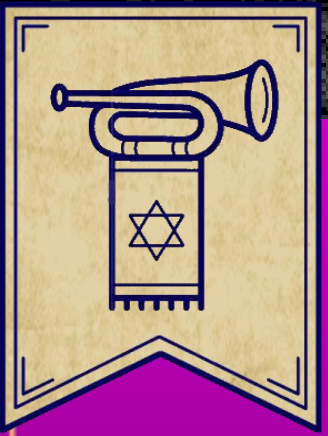
Zechariah 1:20-21

one who shapes, molds, and  
overcomes obstacles through skill  
and strength

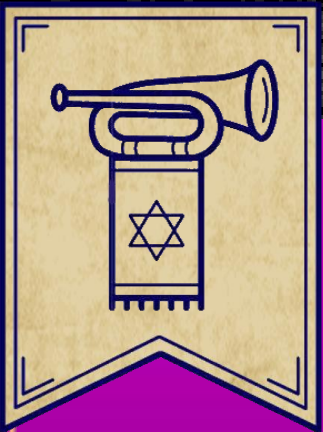




What's striking about this vision is God doesn't promise to immediately remove those horns (Horns still exist)

II Timothy 3:12





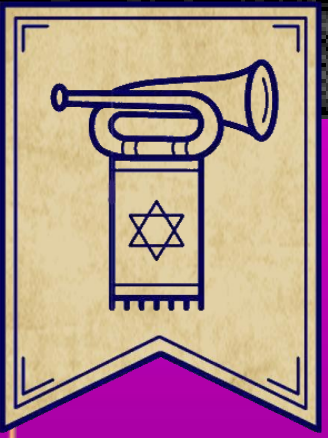
These craftsmen help to remind us that no matter how entrenched evil may seem, God is actively at work





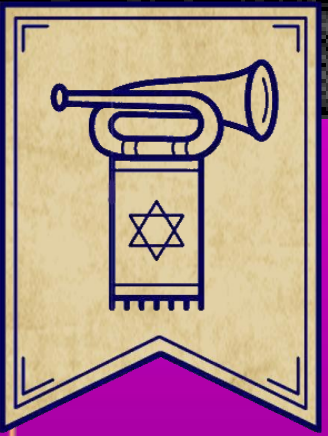
These craftsmen terrify the horns –
