

Sermon Title: **“PRAY FOR ... ONE ANOTHER”**

James 5:1-20

- Part of God’s design is for us to link arms with each other – \_\_\_\_\_ and face life together
- There’s a dangerous \_\_\_\_\_ that is directly associated with denying the Lord His \_\_\_\_\_ as Lord of our lives
- So, don’t be deceived, \_\_\_\_\_, don’t drift from your first love (in \_\_\_\_\_ depend upon the Lord)
- When our \_\_\_\_\_ on God diminishes so does our \_\_\_\_\_
- “Patient” = Literally means to \_\_\_\_\_ without \_\_\_\_\_; to remain steadfast despite facing personal difficulty
- When God answers our prayers with “\_\_\_\_\_” or “\_\_\_\_\_” (understand that’s always the \_\_\_\_\_ for us)
- We often stop praying long before we should (we \_\_\_\_\_ on prayer instead of \_\_\_\_\_ in prayer)
- “\_\_\_\_\_” = This type of prayer is deeper than merely physical healing
- “\_\_\_\_\_” = it includes all forms of distress, trouble or trial
- Our prayers of \_\_\_\_\_ are about engaging God on behalf of \_\_\_\_\_ - in struggles, sharing life
- The \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ faithfully depended upon the Lord (enduring \_\_\_\_\_ and in the face of terrible hardships)
- \_\_\_\_\_ brings to light and exposes our heart level problem and \_\_\_\_\_ takes us beyond recognition and it connects us directly to the Source of our solution - \_\_\_\_\_
