

Sermon Title: **“ASK, SEEK, KNOCK”**

Matthew 7:7-8

- Believers have an \_\_\_\_\_ - \_\_\_\_\_ pass to God, through Jesus. Our Heavenly Father is \_\_\_\_\_ (any time) and He \_\_\_\_\_ any request (great or small)
- Ask, seek, knock – these are \_\_\_\_\_ commands, with \_\_\_\_\_ distinct and precious promises attached (\_\_\_\_\_ and you will receive; \_\_\_\_\_ and you will find; \_\_\_\_\_ and it will be opened)
- Prayer bridges the gap between our \_\_\_\_\_ and God’s inexhaustible \_\_\_\_\_
  - Our Heavenly Father is able (\_\_\_\_\_)
  - and willing to \_\_\_\_\_ us and \_\_\_\_\_ our prayer requests
  - Prayer is TOO vital for us to \_\_\_\_\_ until later
  - Sometimes our prayers \_\_\_\_\_ answered because they \_\_\_\_\_ offered (we’ve \_\_\_\_\_ vocalized them to God)
  - And sometimes our prayers \_\_\_\_\_ answered because they are asked with a \_\_\_\_\_
  - Am I \_\_\_\_\_ ALL that God has for me to \_\_\_\_\_?
- When we ASK, we come to God through \_\_\_\_\_ and we \_\_\_\_\_ our requests
- “Seek” = to pursue after; to crave; to \_\_\_\_\_
  - This type of craving begins in the \_\_\_\_\_. It’s in the \_\_\_\_\_ life, LONG before it takes root in our \_\_\_\_\_
- SEEKING is a \_\_\_\_\_, which dwells on God
- \_\_\_\_\_ (pinpointedly pray over) and \_\_\_\_\_ our prayers to our Heavenly Father (knock and knock)
  - Knocking depicts a \_\_\_\_\_ component (there needs to be an \_\_\_\_\_, where our prayers are faith driven)
- Jesus gives 3 commands (\_\_\_\_\_;\_\_\_\_\_;\_\_\_\_\_) those commands are present active commands, which means they are \_\_\_\_\_
  - It basically means \_\_\_\_\_ asking, \_\_\_\_\_ seeking, and \_\_\_\_\_ knocking (DON’T stop ... do it \_\_\_\_\_ and do it next)
