



In order to really understand the Book of Judges, you have to see what transpired previously (Joshua 24)

Joshua was the leader, who God used to bring the Children of Israel into the Promised Land

Despite being in the Promised Land, each of the 12 tribes were responsible to drive out the inhabitance of the land Joshua 24:1-13

Dwell on the Faithfulness of our Heavenly Father Keep your focus on God & remember what He's done (your present situation DOESN'T surprise God)

Joshua 24:14-28 Do something with the faith we've put in our Heavenly Father

Serving, worshiping, & glorifying God were nonnegotiables for Joshua & his family (God was top priority) Our faith is evidenced by our works

Judges 1:1-3 After Joshua dies, Israel starts off on the right foot

It's impossible for anyone to follow, if we are NOT looking at & listening to our Heavenly Father's instructions Judges 2:1-5

Israel disobeyed God & God then uses the very nations He told them to drive out to drive them to their knees

Instead of Dwelling on the Faithfulness of their Heavenly Father, Israel Dabbles with the Feeble Heathen Fakes Judges 2:11-23

Each time God uses the Judge to deliver Israel from the oppression they were facing, Israel gets comfortable & complacent & reverts back to serving, worshiping, & following counterfeit gods

Judges 8:22-30 On the heels of God delivering Israel from the hands of the Midianites, Israel wants Gideon & his sons to be their kings

Gideon directs Israel's attention back to the Source of their deliverance, their Heavenly Father

Unfortunately, Gideon wanted a special memento to remember what the Lord had done (an ephod)
