

## Judges 11:1-28



Judges 11:1-3 Jephthah's half-brothers were concerned that Jephthah would want to take a piece of their father's inheritance

So Jephthah ran away & ended up living in a place called Tob Judges 11:4-6

At the end of chapter 10, we're left with the sons of Ammon gathering in this corner & the sons of Israel gathering in another (5) The people of Gilead were asking Jephthah to simply lead their army into battle to fight against the sons of Ammon Judges 11:7-9

Although Jephthah was an illegitimate son, his brothers: Should have treated him better & should have at least protected him & in general tended to some of his necessities

Before Jephthah agreed ... he wanted to know things would be better for him after this battle is ALL over Judges 11:10-11

The leaders of Gilead made an oath (a promise) to Jephthah Judges 11:12-13

Jephthah sends messengers to the king of Ammon ... asking "Why are you fighting us? Judges 11:14-17

Fact Check: Israel DIDN'T take away the land of Moab (or for that matter, the land of the children of Ammon) Judges 11:18-20

Israel NEVER even entered the land of Moab It was Sihon, who engaged & waged war on Israel Judges 11:21-22

## But our God (the One True God) was the one who gave Israel victory over Sihon Judges 11:24 Judges 11:25

Even the current king of Moab recognized that Israel rightfully had a claim to this land

So again, why are you (someone who NEVER had a part in this issue) fighting & feeling justified in your fighting? Judges 11:26

& for the last 300 years, since we lived in Heshbon (the main city of Moab), your ancestors NEVER attempted to recover what you claim Israel took from you

Judges 11:27-28 May our God (the One True God) act as a judge between us
